- Bowyer owns career totals of 10 wins, three poles, 82 top-five finishes, 219 top-10s and 3,127 laps led in 520 NASCAR Cup Series races. He also owns eight NASCAR Xfinity Series victories.
  - His most recent Cup Series victory came at Michigan International Speedway in Brooklyn (June 10, 2018).
  - His most recent Cup Series pole came at Auto Club Speedway in Fontana, California on Feb. 29, 2020.
- Last weekend at Indianapolis: Bowyer finished 10<sup>th</sup> in each of the first two stages and appeared headed to a top-10 finish, but a caution just laps after he made a green-flag stop left him down a lap to the leaders and in 17th. He could only climb back to 16th.
- Bowyer at Kentucky: He's earned one top-five finish and two top-10s in nine starts.
- Bowyer at Kentucky in 2019: He started seventh and fell to midpack before pitting for tires and fuel. A caution allowed Bowyer to take the wavearound to return to the lead lap. Strategy put Bowyer near the front of the field to start the second stage and he finished fifth. He started at the front of the pack in the final stage, leading 40 laps before finishing sixth.
- Bowyer at Kentucky in 2018: He started eighth and charged to sixth by the end of the first stage. He finished sixth again in the second stage before a tight-handling car left him with a 12th-place finish.
- Bowyer at Kentucky in 2017: He started 16th and ran in the top-10 until he flat-spotted his tires trying to avoid a three-car accident, dropping him to 22nd. He returned to the top-10 but reported a lack of rear grip that dropped him off the lead lap and left him with a 13th-place finish.
- Kentucky Speedway in Sparta is the only track on the Cup Series circuit where SHR has yet to win. The team has scored four top-five finishes and 13 top-10s in 31 starts on the 1.5-mile oval.
- All-Time Victory List: With 10 career victories, Bowyer is in a 59th-place tie on the all-time wins list with Donnie Allison and Sterling Marlin.
