Notes of Interest:

- Bowyer owns career totals of 10 wins, three poles, 82 top-five finishes, 219 top-10s and 3,127 laps led in 522 NASCAR Cup Series races. He also owns eight NASCAR Xfinity Series victories.
 - His most recent Cup Series victory came at Michigan International Speedway in Brooklyn (June 10, 2018).
 - His most recent Cup Series pole came at Auto Club Speedway in Fontana, California on Feb. 29, 2020.
- Last weekend at Kentucky: Bowyer finished 14th after seeing a likely top-five finish dissolve with a caution after a green-flag pit stop late in the race, as well as damage, before a two-lap shootout to end the race.
- Bowyer at Bristol on May 31: Bowyer started 23rd at Bristol on May 31 and battled a tight-handling car most of the race. His Johnny Klausmeier-led crew kept working on the car and Bowyer staged a late run that saw him move from ninth to second in the last 30 laps to post his best finish of the season.
- 2019 All-Star Race: Bowyer won the pole and led two laps, but handling issues left him with a 12th-place finish.
- 2018 All-Star Race: Bowyer started third and immediately fell back in the pack after he was pinned in the middle lane without a drafting partner. He could not regain the lost spots and finished 19th.
- 2017 All-Star Race: Bowyer started first and led all 20 laps in the opening stage of the NASCAR Monster Energy Open to advance to the All-Star Race. It marked the third time in four years Bowyer advanced into the All-Star Race through the Open. The victory allowed him to sit out Stages 2 and 3. Bowyer started the All-Star Race 17th and quickly reported a loose-handling condition, which left him with a 12th-place finish. Bowyer started Stage 2 ninth and finished 11th. A two-tire stop moved the No. 14 to first place at the start of Stage 3, but handling problems dropped him to 12th. Only the top-10 average finishes in Stages 1, 2 and 3 competed in the fourth and final stage. Bowyer's average finish was just outside the top-10.
- Bowyer owns eight top-five finishes and 16 top-10s in 29 starts at Bristol, and he's led 281 laps.
- All-Time Victory List: With 10 career victories, Bowyer is in a 59th-place tie on the all-time wins list with Donnie Allison and Sterling Marlin.
