New Hampshire Motor Speedway Notes of Interest:

- Cole Custer will make his 23rd career Cup Series start Sunday at New Hampshire Motor Speedway in Loudon. It will be the rookie's first Cup Series start on the mile oval.
- Custer has three NASCAR Xfinity Series starts at the Northeastern track with one pole award and a runner-up finish, both earned last year. In all three starts, the young driver has started and finished inside the top-10.
- The California native has three NASCAR Gander RV & Outdoor Series appearances at New Hampshire. His first start resulted in the pole award and a win by the youngest driver in series history. Custer was just 16 years, 7 months and 28 days old when he accomplished the feat.
- The HaasTooling.com driver earned his first Cup Series win in just his 20th start on July 12 at Kentucky Speedway in Sparta.
- Custer's Kentucky Cup Series win put him in an elite category with only nine other drivers who have won in NASCAR's top three National Series, as well as ARCA and NASCAR's developmental K&N Pro Series.
- The rookie's Cup Series win put him in a category with 33 other drivers who have won in each of NASCAR's top three national series.
- 2020 mark's Custer's first full-time season in the Cup Series, and he is contending for Rookie of the Year honors along with four other competitors. Custer's Kentucky win made him the first rookie driver to win this season.
