Michigan International Speedway Notes of Interest:

- Cole Custer will make his 24th and 25th career NASCAR Cup Series starts on Saturday and Sunday at Michigan International Speedway in Brooklyn. The doubleheader weekend will be the rookie's first Cup Series appearances on the 2-mile oval.
- Custer has three NASCAR Xfinity Series starts at Michigan with a best finish of third earned in 2018. In all three starts, he's started and finished inside the top-12.
- The Ford driver has one Michigan start in the NASCAR Gander RV & Outdoors Truck Series. He started 18th and finished 22nd.
- Custer will join Charlotte's sports radio WFNZ 102.5 FM with Wilson and Parcell tonight (Tuesday) at 5:26 p.m. EDT to provide his analysis of this weekend's races.
- The HaasTooling.com driver earned his first Cup Series win in just his 20th start on July 12 at Kentucky Speedway in Sparta.
- Custer's Kentucky Cup Series win put him in an elite category with only nine other drivers who have won in NASCAR's top three National Series, as well as in ARCA and NASCAR's developmental K&N Pro Series.
- The rookie's Cup Series win put him in a category with 33 other drivers who have won in each of NASCAR's top three national series.
- 2020 mark's Custer's first full-time season in the Cup Series, and he is contending for Rookie of the Year honors along with four other competitors. Custer's Kentucky win made him the first rookie driver to win this season.
