



## KEVIN HARVICK: Career Highlights

### 2020

- Finished fifth in the NASCAR Cup Series points standings as a member of the 16-driver playoffs. Missed the Championship Four for just the second time since 2014 but scored nine victories, 20 top-fives and 27 top-10 finishes and led 1,531 laps. All were series-high.
- Scored victories on May 17 at Darlington (S.C) Raceway, June 7 at Atlanta Motor Speedway in Hampton, Georgia, June 27 at Pocono Raceway in Long Pong, Pennsylvania, July 5 at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway, August 8 and 9 at Michigan International Speedway in Brooklyn, August 23 at Dover (Del.) International Speedway, September 6 at Darlington and September 19 at Bristol. Has set a new career-high with nine victories in one season.
- Clinched the Regular Season Championship on Aug. 23 at Dover.
- Won his 50<sup>th</sup> NASCAR Cup Series race during NASCAR's return from the COVID-19 pandemic at Darlington.
- Is ninth on the all-time NASCAR Cup Series wins list with 58 victories and is 18 wins behind the late Dale Earnhardt who eighth with 76 checkered flags. Harvick leads the active driver list in victories.
- When he won both races during the Michigan doubleheader, he was the first to win races in two consecutive days since Richard Petty did so in 1971. Petty won the Albany-Saratoga 250 on July 14, 1971 at Albany-Saratoga Speedway in Malta, New York, and the next day won the Islip 250 at Islip (N.Y.) Speedway. Islip closed in 1984, but Albany-Saratoga is still in operation.
- Led his 10,000<sup>th</sup> lap in an SHR car when he took the lead on lap 37 in May at Darlington and led his 11,000<sup>th</sup> lap in an SHR car when he led lap 476 in September at Bristol.
- Led his 15,000<sup>th</sup> lap in his NASCAR Career when was leading on lap 161 on August 23 at Dover.
- Made his 700<sup>th</sup> career Cup Series start on July 19 at Texas Motor Speedway in Fort Worth. Also surpassed 200,000 laps completed in his Cup career in the same race.

### 2019

- Finished third in NASCAR Cup Series point standings as a member of the 16-driver playoffs. Advanced to the Championship 4 for the fifth time in last six years. Finished in the top-five in the standings for the 11<sup>th</sup> time in his career.
- Won four point-paying Cup Series races – July 21 at New Hampshire Motor Speedway in Loudon, Aug. 11 at Michigan International Speedway in Brooklyn, Sept. 8 at Indianapolis Motor Speedway and Nov. 3 at Texas Motor Speedway in Fort Worth.
- Harvick's win at Texas was his 49<sup>th</sup> career win and it put him 14<sup>th</sup> on the all-time NASCAR win list, tying him with Stewart-Haas Racing (SHR) co-owner and NASCAR Hall of Famer Tony Stewart.
- Captured six Cup Series poles – March 1 at Las Vegas Motor Speedway, April 12 at Richmond (Va.) Raceway, May 10 at Kansas Speedway in Kansas City, July 27 at Pocono (Pa.) Raceway, Sept. 8 at Indianapolis and Nov. 2 at Texas.
- Won non-points Duel at Daytona Feb. 14 at Daytona (Fla.) International Speedway to earn a third-place starting spot in the Daytona 500.
- Harvick led the 14,000<sup>th</sup> lap of his career Nov. 17 at Homestead-Miami Speedway. He has led 14,034 laps in his career, which puts him 11<sup>th</sup> all-time.

### 2018

- Finished third in NASCAR Cup Series point standings as a member of the 16-driver playoffs. Advanced to the Championship 4 for the fourth time in last five years. Finished in the top-five in the standings for the 10<sup>th</sup> time in his career.
- Won a career-high eight Cup Series point races, which tied him with Kyle Busch for the most wins in 2018. Scored victories Feb. 25 at Atlanta Motor Speedway, March 4 at Las Vegas, March 11 at Phoenix Raceway, May 6 at Dover (Del.) International Speedway, May 12 at Kansas, July 22 at New Hampshire, Aug. 12 at Michigan and Nov. 4 at Texas.
- Harvick's win at Las Vegas was the 100<sup>th</sup> of his career in NASCAR's top three series and his 100<sup>th</sup> top-10 since joining Stewart-Haas Racing (SHR) in 2014.
- Victory at Phoenix was Harvick's 40<sup>th</sup> career Cup Series win and it marked only the 24<sup>th</sup> time in NASCAR's modern era (1972 to present) where a driver has won three consecutive races.
- By winning at Kansas Speedway, Harvick's notched his fifth win and became the first driver to notch five wins in the first 12 races of the season since Jeff Gordon in 1997.
- Won the NASCAR All-Star Race at Charlotte (N.C.) Motor Speedway on May 20. It marked the second All-Star win of Harvick's career. He also won the 2007 All-Star Race. He became the seventh driver to win more than one All-Star Race.
- Harvick led his 1,000<sup>th</sup> lap of the season at Chicagoland Speedway in Joliet, Illinois, on July 1. It marked the fourth time he led at least 1,000 laps in a season since joining SHR.
- Harvick led the 13,000<sup>th</sup> lap of his career Nov. 11 at Phoenix. He has led 13,081 laps in his career, which puts him 12<sup>th</sup> all-time and just 129 laps behind Bobby Isaac for 11<sup>th</sup>-place.
- Finished in the top-five 23 times and in the top-10 29 times. Set a career record for top-10 finishes and tied his 2015 mark of top-five results.
- Won NASCAR Xfinity Series race Feb. 24 at Atlanta Motor Speedway. The win was his first for Stewart-Haas Racing with Fred Biagi, his series-best fifth at Atlanta and the 47<sup>th</sup> of his Xfinity Series career.

**2017**

- Finished third in the NASCAR Cup Series point standings as a member of the 16-driver playoffs. Advanced to the Championship 4 for the third time in last four years.
- Won two Cup Series point races – June 25 at Sonoma (Calif.) Raceway and Nov. 5 at Texas. Harvick’s win at Texas was the 37<sup>th</sup> of his Cup Series career and tied him with Bobby Isaac for 21<sup>st</sup> on the all-time win list.
- Cup Series wins at Texas and Sonoma were his first at each track, leaving Pocono and Kentucky Speedway in Sparta as the only active tracks where Harvick has yet to record a Cup Series victory.
- Led 149 laps at Charlotte on Oct. 7 to become the 17<sup>th</sup> Cup Series driver to lead 11,000 laps.
- Made 600<sup>th</sup> career Cup Series start on Sept. 9 at Richmond (Va.) Raceway.
- Finished ninth in the Southern 500 at Darlington (S.C.) Raceway on Sept. 3 to record 300<sup>th</sup> top-10 finish of his Cup Series career, becoming only the 17<sup>th</sup> driver in Cup Series history to accomplish the feat.
- Won four Cup Series poles – March 3 at Atlanta, April 7 at Texas, May 26 at Charlotte and Sept. 2 at Darlington.
- Won the NASCAR K&N Pro Series West Carneros 200 race at Sonoma on June 24. It was Harvick’s second win at Sonoma in the K&N Pro Series West, with his first coming in 1998.
- Led 292 laps in the Cup Series race at Atlanta on March 5 – a new single-race best at the 1.54 mile oval.

**2016**

- Finished eighth in the NASCAR Cup Series point standings as a member of the 16-driver playoffs.
- Won four Cup Series point races – March 13 at Phoenix, Aug. 21 at Bristol (Tenn.) Motor Speedway, Sept. 25 at New Hampshire and Oct. 16 at Kansas.
- Harvick’s .010 of a second margin of victory over Carl Edwards at Phoenix was the closest in series history at the venue.
- The victory at New Hampshire came in Harvick’s 100<sup>th</sup> Cup Series start with Stewart-Haas Racing.
- Won two Cup Series poles – Oct. 6 at Charlotte and Nov. 18 at Homestead-Miami Speedway.
- Scored his 150<sup>th</sup> career Cup Series top-five finish Sept. 10 at Richmond.
- Led 214 laps at Darlington to surpass 1,000 laps led for the season. It marked the third consecutive season in which he led 1,000 laps or more.
- Led his 10,000 lap in Cup Series competition at Darlington on Sept. 4.

**2015**

- Finished runner-up in the NASCAR Cup Series championship point standings by a single point to champion Kyle Busch.
- Won three Cup Series point races – March 8 at Las Vegas, March 15 at Phoenix and Oct. 4 at Dover. The successive wins at Las Vegas and Phoenix marked the third time Harvick scored back-to-back Cup Series victories.
- Won Cup Series pole March 13 at Phoenix.
- Started the season with seven straight top-10 finishes, including six finishes in the top-two. Became the first Cup Series driver to start a season with five consecutive top-two finishes.
- Scored eighth straight finishes of second or better, a streak that began at Texas in November 2014 and ended at Martinsville (Va.) Speedway in March.
- Established his new single-season career-high by leading 2,294 laps in the Cup Series.
- Recorded 22 top-five finishes to set a new single-season career-high, eclipsing his 16 top-fives earned in 2010.
- Recorded 27 top-10 finishes to set a new single-season career-high, besting his 26 top-10s in 2010.
- Led 355 laps at Dover on Oct. 4, setting a new personal record for laps led in a single Cup Series event.
- Led his 2,000<sup>th</sup> lap of the season at Dover on Oct. 4, becoming the first driver since Jeff Gordon in 1995 and 1996 to lead more than 2,000 laps in consecutive seasons.
- Became the 10<sup>th</sup> Cup Series driver to score double-digit runner-up finishes in a single season (13).
- Scored his 250<sup>th</sup> career top-10 finish in 526<sup>th</sup> career Cup Series starts at Bristol on Aug. 22.
- Won the ESPY “Best Driver” award.
- On April 22, Harvick and the No. 4 team were honored by President Barack Obama on the South Lawn of the White House for their 2014 NASCAR Cup Series championship.
- Bakersfield, California, mayor Harvey Hall proclaimed Wednesday, March 18, 2015 as “Kevin Harvick Day” in hometown. Also on March 18, The Kevin Harvick Foundation, in partnership with the Cal Ripken Sr. Foundation, announced a plan to renovate and remodel the gymnasium and outdoor play area of the Boys & Girls Club of Kern County.

## 2014

- Earned first NASCAR Cup Series championship by one point over Ryan Newman. Harvick won back-to-back Cup Series races at Phoenix and Homestead to finish the season and secure the championship.
- Joined Bobby Labonte and Brad Keselowski as the only drivers to earn both a NASCAR Cup Series championship and a NASCAR Xfinity Series championship.
- Won five Cup Series point races – March 2 at Phoenix, April 12 at Darlington, Oct. 12 at Charlotte, Nov. 9 at Phoenix and Nov. 16 at Homestead.
- Won eight Cup Series poles – April 11 at Darlington, May 9 at Kansas, June 13 at Michigan, July 26 at Indianapolis, Aug. 22 at Bristol, Aug. 29 at Atlanta, Sept. 26 at Dover and Oct. 3 at Kansas.
- Swept Cup Series races at Phoenix by winning races on March 2 and Nov. 9.
- Swept Cup Series poles at Kansas by winning poles on May 9 and Oct. 3
- Set the Cup Series qualifying record at Kansas on Oct. 3 (Round 2: 27.304 seconds at 197.773 mph)
- Set the Cup Series qualifying record at Bristol on Aug. 22 (Round 2: 14.607 seconds at 131.362 mph)
- Set the Cup Series qualifying record at Indianapolis on July 26 (Round 1: 47.753 seconds at 188.470 mph)
- Set the Cup Series qualifying record at Michigan on June 13 (Round 3: 35.198 seconds at 204.557 mph). It was the fastest pole-winning speed since April 1987 when Bill Elliott set the all-time Cup Series qualifying record of 212.809 mph at Talladega.

## 2013

- Finished third in the NASCAR Cup Series point standings as a member of the 13-driver playoffs.
- Won four Cup Series point races – April 27 at Richmond, May 26 at Charlotte, Oct. 6 at Kansas and Nov. 10 at Phoenix.
- Won Cup Series pole Oct. 4 at Kansas, breaking a 254-race pole drought dating back to New Hampshire in September 2006.
- Won the non-points Sprint Unlimited Feb. 16 at Daytona for the third time in his career.
- Won the non-points Duel at Daytona Feb. 21 at Daytona to earn a third-place starting spot in the Daytona 500.
- Won NASCAR Xfinity Series race Aug. 31 at Atlanta.

## 2012

- Finished eighth in the NASCAR Cup Series point standings as a member of the 12-driver playoffs.
- Won Cup Series race Nov. 11 at Phoenix.
- Won two Xfinity Series races – Sept. 7 at Richmond and Nov. 3 at Texas.
- Won Xfinity Series pole April 27 at Richmond.
- Won NASCAR Truck Series race March 31 at Martinsville.
- Won two Truck Series poles – March 31 at Martinsville and June 1 at Dover.

## 2011

- Finished third in the NASCAR Cup Series point standings for the second consecutive year as a member of the 12-driver playoffs.
- Won four Cup Series point races – March 27 at Auto Club Speedway in Fontana, California, April 3 at Martinsville, May 29 at Charlotte and Sept. 10 at Richmond.
- Harvick's successive wins at Fontana and Martinsville marked the second time he won back-to-back Cup Series races in career.
- Won Xfinity Series pole July 1 at Daytona.
- Won four Truck Series races – Aug. 7 at Pocono, Aug. 20 at Michigan, Aug. 24 at Bristol and Nov. 4 at Texas. Three of those wins – Pocono, Michigan and Bristol – came in successive races.
- Earned his Truck Series pole Aug. 6 at Pocono.
- Won third Truck Series championship as an owner with driver Ron Hornaday Jr.

## 2010

- Finished third in the NASCAR Cup Series point standings as a member of the 12-driver playoffs.
- Won three Cup Series point races – April 25 at Talladega, July 3 at Daytona and Aug. 15 at Michigan.
- Won the non-points Sprint Unlimited race on Feb. 6 at Daytona for the second straight time.
- Won three Xfinity Series races – Feb. 27 at Las Vegas, April 3 at Nashville (Tenn.) Superspeedway and Sept. 10 at Richmond.
- Won three Xfinity Series poles – April 23 at Talladega, July 9 at Chicagoland Speedway and Sept. 10 at Richmond.

- Won Daytona 500 on Feb. 18. It was Harvick's 11<sup>th</sup> career Cup Series victory and his first on a restrictor-plate track.
- Won the non-points All-Star Race May 19 at Charlotte.
- Won six Xfinity Series races – Feb. 17 at Daytona, June 30 at New Hampshire, July 14 at Chicagoland, Aug. 4 at Circuit Gilles Villeneuve in Montreal, Aug. 11 at Watkins Glen and Nov. 3 at Texas.

- Won five Cup Series point races – April 22 at Phoenix, Aug. 13 at Watkins Glen, Sept. 9 at Richmond, Sept. 17 at New Hampshire and Nov. 12 at Phoenix.
- The successive wins at Richmond and New Hampshire marked the first time Harvick scored back-to-back Cup Series victories.
- Harvick's Watkins Glen victory was his seventh career Cup Series victory and his first on a road course.
- Scored fifth career Cup Series pole Sept. 15 at New Hampshire.
- Won nine Xfinity Series races – April 15 at Nashville, April 21 at Phoenix, May 5 at Richmond, July 22 at Martinsville, Aug. 5 at Indianapolis Raceway Park, Sept. 8 at Richmond, Sept. 30 at Kansas, Oct. 28 at Memphis (Tenn.) Motorsports Park and Nov. 4 at Texas.
- Earned second Xfinity Series championship Oct. 13. It was the earliest clinching of the championship in Xfinity Series history, as Harvick claimed the title with four races remaining in the season. He ended the season with a record 824-point margin in the final standings.

- Won five Xfinity Series poles – April 25 at Fontana, May 23 at Charlotte, Aug. 29 at Darlington, Oct. 10 at Charlotte and Oct. 30 at Phoenix.
- Helped Richard Childress Racing (RCR) earn Xfinity Series owner championship.

**2002**

- Finished 21<sup>st</sup> in the NASCAR Cup Series point standings.
- Won Cup Series race July 14 at Chicagoland.
- Earned his first career Cup Series pole July 5 at Daytona.
- Driving a Kevin Harvick, Inc. (KHI) truck, won his first career Truck Series race Nov. 8 at Phoenix.
- Became the fifth driver to win at least one race in each of NASCAR's three national series – Cup Series, Xfinity and Truck.
- Secured IROC XXVI championship with a fifth-place finish in the season finale Aug. 3 at Indianapolis. En route to the IROC championship, Harvick scored his first IROC victory April 27 at Fontana. Harvick became the first rookie to win the IROC title since Ricky Rudd in 1992.

**2001**

- Finished ninth in the NASCAR Cup Series point standings and won the rookie-of-the-year title.
- Picked to replace Dale Earnhardt after Earnhardt died from injuries suffered in a last-lap crash at the Daytona 500.
- Won his first career Cup Series points race March 11 at Atlanta. Harvick earned the victory in just his third career Cup start.
- Won Cup Series race July 15 at Chicagoland.
- Earned first Xfinity Series championship by 124 points over Jeff Green.
- Won five Xfinity Series races – March 31 at Texas, June 16 at Kentucky Speedway in Sparta, July 21 at Gateway, Aug. 4 at Indianapolis Raceway Park and Aug. 24 at Bristol.
- Won four Xfinity Series poles – March 24 at Bristol, April 14 at Nashville, May 12 at New Hampshire and July 1 at the Milwaukee Mile in West Allis, Wisconsin.
- Voted Xfinity Series Most Popular Driver.
- Became owner of a Truck Series team with driver Rick Carelli.

- Finished third in the Xfinity Series point standings and won the Rookie of the Year title.
- Won first career Xfinity Series race July 29 at Gateway.
- Won two additional Xfinity Series races – Aug. 25 at Bristol and Oct. 29 at Memphis.

- Competed full time in the Truck Series, scoring six top-five and 11 top-10 finishes in 25 races.
- Competed in two ARCA Series races for RCR – Charlotte and Talladega. Twice finished in the top-five.

**1998**

- Posted three top-five and five top-10 finishes in 26 Truck Series races.
- Won K&N Pro Series West championship. Won five races (Las Vegas, Altamont (Calif.), Fontana, Pikes Peak (Colo.) and Sonoma and five poles.

- Ran 13 Truck Series races for Wayne Spears. Twice finished in the top-10.
- Competed in three K&N Pro Series West races, scoring two top-10 finishes.
